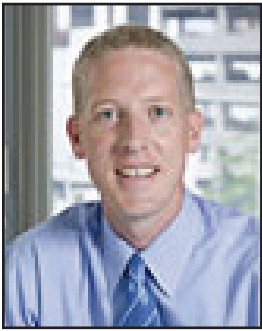

BOARD NOTE

**AIA Grassroots Leadership Conference Report
Washington DC - February 2011**

I had the privilege of attending the AIA Grassroots Leadership Conference in Washington DC in February. This was my second time at Grassroots. The theme of the conference was Design|Voices. This theme was expressed perfectly by Jeffery Potter, FAIA (National First Vice-President & Grassroots Chair): "The value the AIA and its members place on design is nearly equaled by the importance of communicating that value. Yet how and who speaks are questions often left unanswered or left to someone else to respond. No more. We are the design voices – AIA Members working with

and through the components."

The first night of the conference was highlighted by the AIA Leadership Celebration and Reception. This event was held in the great hall of the Building Museum – which is an amazing architectural space. The Celebration was an evening of food, conversation, presentations, and the inauguration of the new AIA President, Clark Manus, FAIA. The night showed me the importance of the AIA to the future of architecture and to the ever-changing world around us.

The second day of the conference is devoted to political advocacy for the AIA and for the architecture profession. During our visits on Capitol Hill, Stan Bowman (Executive Director of AIA WA Council) and I were able to meet with Representative Cathy McMorris-Rodgers in her office. We presented the updated Rebuild & Renew: The AIA's Plan for Rebuilding Main Street. She was very supportive of our agenda items. Our message that design work funding is needed now to fuel the construction industry and overall economy was well-received and understood. Personally meeting our elected officials in Washington DC is an opportunity that I always look forward to.

I was able to attend outstanding training sessions each day of the conference. Some of the session topics were: collaborative leadership skills, developing successful volunteers, and strategic planning. The focus of these workshops was to help make leaders and components (like AIA Spokane) more effective, more successful, more active and more energized. One of my favorite workshops was led by a group of young architects from AIA Omaha. Their chapter is all volunteer based – they have no paid support staff. They have an extremely well-organized, active and engaged chapter. They have a master plan in place for each year's events and activities. I was inspired to bring some of their successful ideas to Spokane.

On the last morning of the conference I was able to visit the Holocaust Memorial Museum. This was an emotional experience. The overall design and architecture of the museum guides you through the exhibits and display in a way that creates intense emotions. There are "relief/rest spaces" on each floor that allows visitors to pause, reflect and prepare themselves for the next level of exhibits. The tour concludes with the Hall of Remembrance – which is an awe-inspiring space to experience. The Hall is filled with daylight and a sense of hope and renewed life. I will never forget the emotional journey that I took as I walked through the building. Architect James Ingo Freed (of Pei Cobb Freed & Partners) described the museum's architecture in this way – "The intent of the building is to be a resonator of your own imagery, of your own memory."

Grassroots energized and inspired me to continue to be actively involved in the AIA. The AIA is an incredible group of professionals all across the country who want to see the importance of design

effectively communicated. The AIA has sharpened its focus to advance the profession in ways that are practical, adaptive and innovative. All of us have the opportunity to be advocates for good design – to express our voices more effectively to our clients and to the public.

My challenge to AIA Spokane Members – get involved, volunteer, share your knowledge, make a difference...use your creative talents to help our communities be a better place.
